



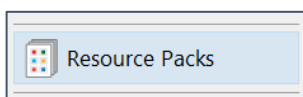
Getting started with Presentation Export

What is Presentation Export?

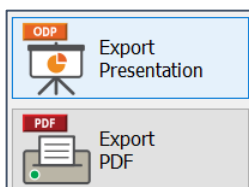
Presentation Export allows you to export documents created in InPrint 3 as slideshow presentations. These presentations can be opened with Microsoft PowerPoint, Google Slides, and other presentation software. Enhance your presentations with symbols by using over 80 pre-made templates and example resources, including classroom activities, symbol information books, quizzes, and so much more.

To get started follow these simple steps:

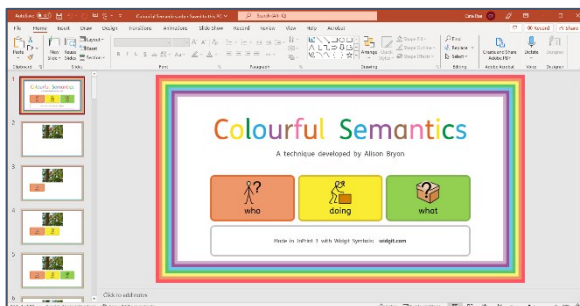
1. Open an example resource
File tab - Resource Packs – Presentations folder



2. Export it as a presentation
File tab - Export Presentation button



3. See how this works in **PowerPoint** or **Google Slides**



4. Edit and personalise the resource back in **InPrint 3**
5. Export your modified version from the File Tab

Open, export, and modify example resources

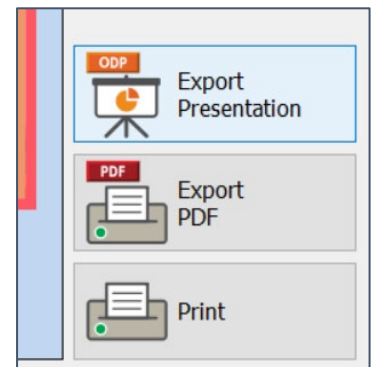
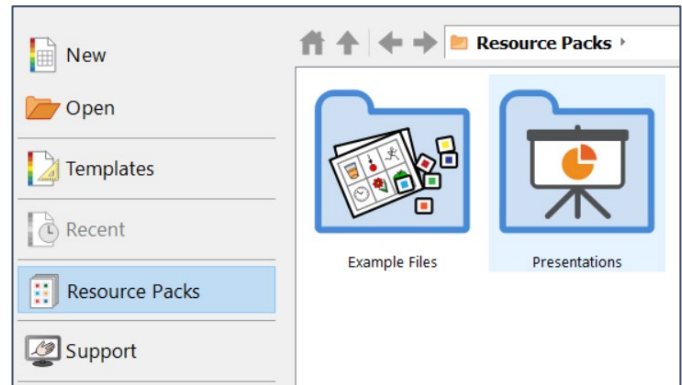
We recommend that you first look at the **Presentations** folder in the **Resource Packs** area. You can access this from the **File** tab.

This folder contains a selection of pre-made resources that can be immediately exported as a presentation.

Browse and pick a resource that looks useful to you and open it. To export this file as a presentation, go back to the **File** tab and click the **Export Presentation** button. This will export and open the presentation file. Play the presentation to see how the resource is intended to be used.

The next step is to modify these example resources for your own use. Make changes, add your own content, duplicate slides, and export a new presentation for you to use.

Presentation documents have access to the new **Presentation Tab**. This allows you to use new features such as adding a link between slides, changing the background colour of slides, and rearranging slides from the **Page Manager**.



Use Templates

Each of our example resources was made using a template, that is available from the **Templates** area. Open a template that matches the example resource you used previously to create a presentation with your own content. When you are finished, export it as a presentation.
